

<sup>1</sup>A Psalm or Song for the sabbath day. It is a good thing to give thanks unto the LORD, and to sing praises unto thy name, O most High:<sup>2</sup>To shew forth thy lovingkindness in the morning, and thy faithfulness every night,<sup>3</sup>Upon an instrument of ten strings, and upon the psaltery; upon the harp with a solemn sound.<sup>4</sup>For thou, LORD, hast made me glad through thy work: I will triumph in the works of thy hands.<sup>5</sup>O LORD, how great are thy works! and thy thoughts are very deep.<sup>6</sup>A brutish man knoweth not; neither doth a fool understand this.<sup>7</sup>When the wicked spring as the grass, and when all the workers of iniquity do flourish; it is that they shall be destroyed for ever:<sup>8</sup>But thou, LORD, art most high for evermore.<sup>9</sup>For, lo, thine enemies, O LORD, for, lo, thine enemies shall perish; all the workers of iniquity shall be scattered.<sup>10</sup>But my horn shalt thou exalt like the horn of an unicorn: I shall be anointed with fresh oil.<sup>11</sup>Mine eye also shall see my desire on mine enemies, and mine ears shall hear my desire of the wicked that rise up against me.<sup>12</sup>The righteous shall flourish like the palm tree: he shall grow like a cedar in Lebanon.<sup>13</sup>Those that be planted in the house of the LORD shall flourish in the courts of our God.<sup>14</sup>They shall still bring forth fruit in old age; they shall be fat and flourishing;<sup>15</sup>To shew that the LORD is upright: he is my rock, and there is no unrighteousness in him.

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
