

<sup>1</sup>At this also my heart trembleth, and is moved out of his place. <sup>2</sup>Hear attentively the noise of his voice, and the sound that goeth out of his mouth. <sup>3</sup>He directeth it under the whole heaven, and his lightning unto the ends of the earth. <sup>4</sup>After it a voice roareth: he thundereth with the voice of his excellency; and he will not stay them when his voice is heard. <sup>5</sup>God thundereth marvellously with his voice; great things doeth he, which we cannot comprehend. <sup>6</sup>For he saith to the snow, Be thou on the earth; likewise to the small rain, and to the great rain of his strength. <sup>7</sup>He sealeth up the hand of every man; that all men may know his work. <sup>8</sup>Then the beasts go into dens, and remain in their places. <sup>9</sup>Out of the south cometh the whirlwind: and cold out of the north. <sup>10</sup>By the breath of God frost is given: and the breadth of the waters is straitened. <sup>11</sup>Also by watering he wearieth the thick cloud: he scattereth his bright cloud: <sup>12</sup>And it is turned round about by his counsels: that they may do whatsoever he commandeth them upon the face of the world in the earth. <sup>13</sup>He causeth it to come, whether for correction, or for his land, or for mercy. <sup>14</sup>Hearken unto this, O Job: stand still, and consider the wondrous works of God. <sup>15</sup>Dost thou know when God disposed them, and caused the light of his cloud to shine? <sup>16</sup>Dost thou know the balancings of the clouds, the wondrous works of him which is perfect in knowledge? <sup>17</sup>How thy garments are warm, when he quieteth the earth by the south wind? <sup>18</sup>Hast thou with him spread out the sky, which is strong, and as a molten looking glass? <sup>19</sup>Teach us what we shall say unto him; for we cannot order our speech by reason of darkness. <sup>20</sup>Shall it be told him that I speak? if a man speak, surely he shall be swallowed up. <sup>21</sup>And now men see not the bright light which is in the clouds: but the wind passeth, and cleanseth them. <sup>22</sup>Fair weather cometh out of the north: with God is terrible majesty. <sup>23</sup>Touching the Almighty, we cannot find him out: he is excellent in power, and in judgment, and in plenty of justice: he will not afflict. <sup>24</sup>Men do therefore fear him: he respecteth not any that are wise of heart.
